CAN POLLUTE WATERWAYS AND CAUSE ECOLOGICAL DISRUPTION. THEY CAN ALSO
CONTAMINATE GROUNDWATER AND SOILS, WHICH CAN LEAD TO HUMAN HEALTH
PROBLEMS AND ENVIRONMENTAL DAMAGE. WATER POLLUTION IS A MAJOR
ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUE IN INDIA, AND IT IS CRUCIAL TO ADDRESS IT IN ORDER
TO PROTECT THE ENVIRONMENT AND THE HEALTH OF THE POPULATION.
