Dear Mrs Weizman,

I suggest that we
cable to our Minister in Moscow
(Dr Elyashiv, whom you know well)
about your desire to visit the Soviet
Union and consult him as to proceed-
ing our feeling is that the best
course would be for the Legation to
approach the authorities in Moscow
with a request for a visa on a

diplomatic passport. So I am
cabling accordingly and shall
communicate with you as soon
as I have a reply.
