Last night, the British, Arab and Jewish delegates held another informal joint meeting. Those present were Mr. MacDonald and Lord Halifax, for the Government; the representatives of the Arab States; and Dr. Weizman, Mr. D. Ben-Gurion, Mr. M. Shertok, and Lord Bearsted.

#### NO PROPOSALS, NO PROGRESS

Palcor says that the meeting resolved on no further progress. Originally the meeting had been arranged to take place in Mr. MacDonald's room in the House of Commons; and was purported to be a talk of extreme privacy, not even dubbed "informal"; but for some reason the Government, at the last moment, changed its plans and the talks took place in St. James's Palace.

No proposals were understood to have been made, the proceedings being confined to an appeal by the Arab States to the Jewish Agency representatives to agree to a stoppage of Jewish immigration.

Reuter, reporting the meeting, states that the Arab delegates appealed to the Jewish participants to make concessions on their immigration demands, stressing their eagerness to be conciliatory if such concessions were made. The discussion was cordial and extremely informal but achieved no progress.
