JEWISH AGENCY PLANS DISCUSSED IN LONDON

The visit to London of Mr. M. Shertok, Head of the Jewish Agency's Political Department in Jerusalem, to "discuss plans for saving as many Jews as possible from the Nazi terror" was reported by the BBC yesterday.

Mr. Shertok, who addressed a press conference at the Jewish Agency offices in Great Russell Street on Monday afternoon, gave facts and figures of the recruiting position, outlined the various disappointments encountered, and also gave details of other aspects of Palestine Jewry's war effort.

The numerous press representatives present showed lively interest regarding Palestine's ability to absorb rescued Jews, especially children. Many questioners expressed surprise that the American and British Governments were unable to transport 1,000 Jewish children with Palestine certificates from Iran to Palestine via Iraq.

Replying to a question, Mr. Shertok stated that the Jewish Agency was negotiating with important non-Zionist quarters, especially America, for a unified policy. Regarding negotiations between Zionists and non-Zionists in the United States on the peace conference programme, Mr. Shertok said that he believed that there was some possibility of an agreement.
